



Traffic Pattern Changes on East Capitol Street Bridge on Thursday, October 22, 2020

(Washington, D.C.) — The District Department of Transportation (DDOT) will change the traffic pattern on the Whitney Young Memorial Bridge (also known as the East Capitol Street Bridge) starting on or about Thursday, October 22, 2020, weather permitting. This traffic pattern change is necessary to begin the final phase of the Rehabilitation of the Whitney Young Memorial Bridge Project. The following changes will be in place and are further exhibited in the graphics below:

- The left lane of traffic in both the eastbound and westbound directions will be closed from October 22 until the anticipated completion of the final phase of the project in December, weather permitting.
- The permanent 295 ramps will be reopened, and the temporary ramps will be removed during this final phase.





Traffic controls will be in place to guide motorists through the work zone safely. Motorists are advised to stay alert and be observant of signage and road work crews while traveling in this area.
