


REHABILITATION OF THE EAST CAPITOL STREET BRIDGE



PROJECT BACKGROUND

The East Capitol Street Bridge (also known as the Whitney Young Jr. Memorial Bridge) carries vehicular and pedestrian traffic over the Anacostia River and Kingman Lake in Southeast Washington, DC near RFK Stadium. The north structure of the bridge carries three lanes of westbound traffic plus a pedestrian sidewalk. The south structure of the bridge carries three lanes of eastbound traffic plus a pedestrian sidewalk. The bridge was originally constructed in 1955, and repairs are needed to the bridge deck, concrete abutments and steel girder system.

PROJECT OBJECTIVE

DDOT is undertaking this bridge project to eliminate deficiencies and to make the bridge safer for the traveling public.

- Substructure and Superstructure Improvements
- Pedestrian/Bicycle Improvements
- Trail Connection for Anacostia Riverwalk Trail Access
- Upgrades to Overhead Signage
- Drainage Improvements
- Roadway Resurfacing
